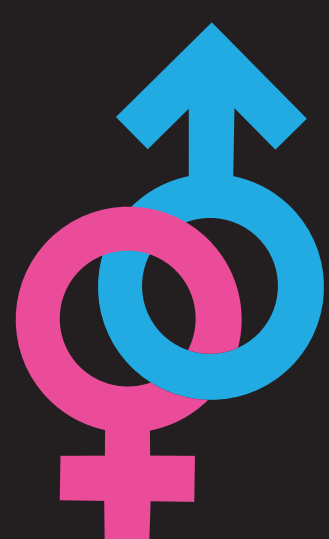


THE GENDER DIVIDE



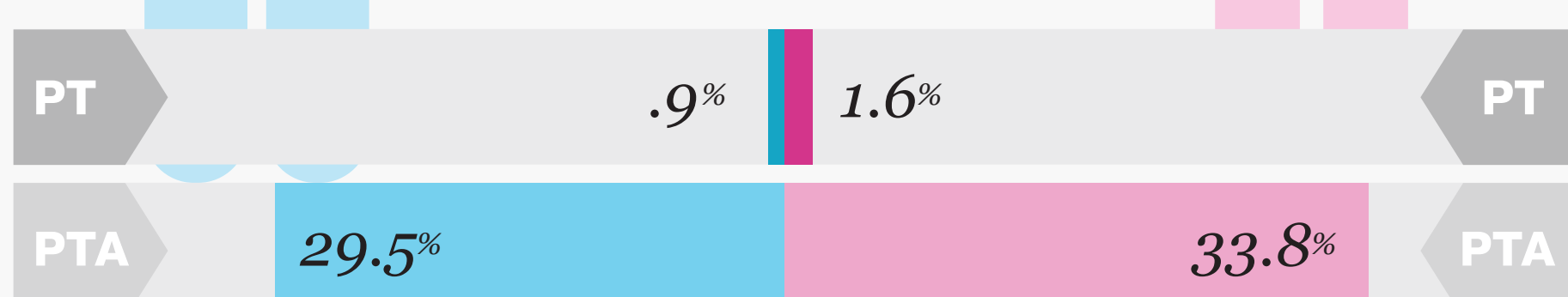
Every year at *ADVANCE*, we gather anonymous data from across the country to produce our eagerly awaited Salary Survey. A total of 1,023 rehabilitation professionals submitted their information online between Nov. 1, 2015, and Jan. 31, 2016.

Participants included 669 physical therapists, 292 physical therapist assistants, 31 professors, and another 31 respondents who classified themselves as "other."

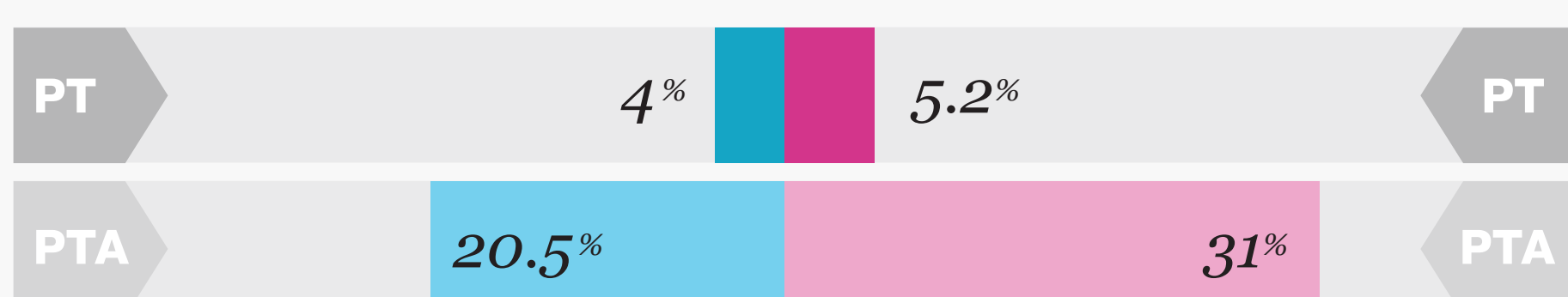
Our research resulted in some enlightening information regarding the state of PT and PTA salaries. One field of interest is gender.

How do the salaries of female PTs and PTAs measure up to their male colleagues?

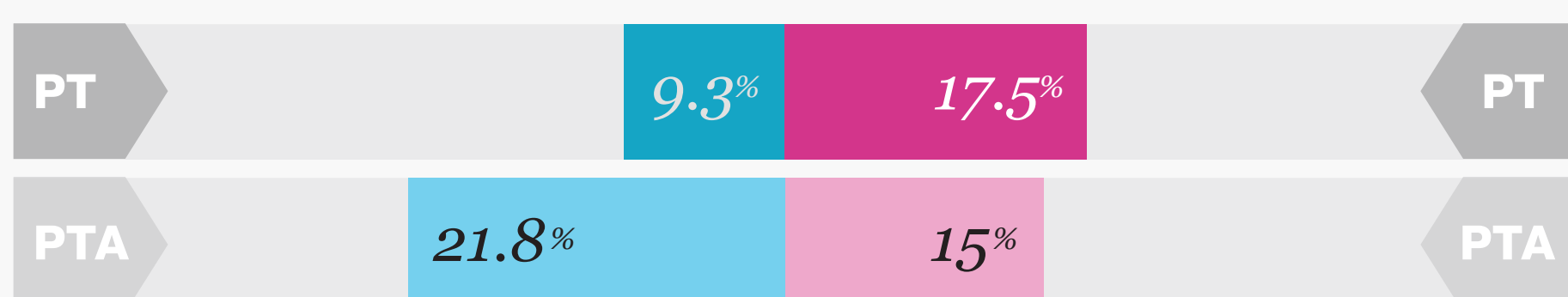
\$45,000-\$54,999



\$55,000-\$64,999

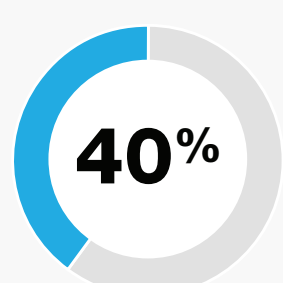


\$65,000-\$74,999

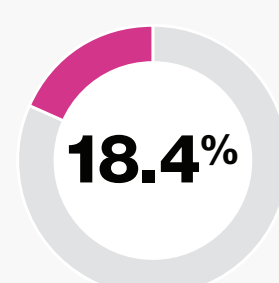


PTA SALARIES: EVEN MORE STRIKING

Over 73% of PTA respondents to our survey were female. Yet the salary divide is even more striking.

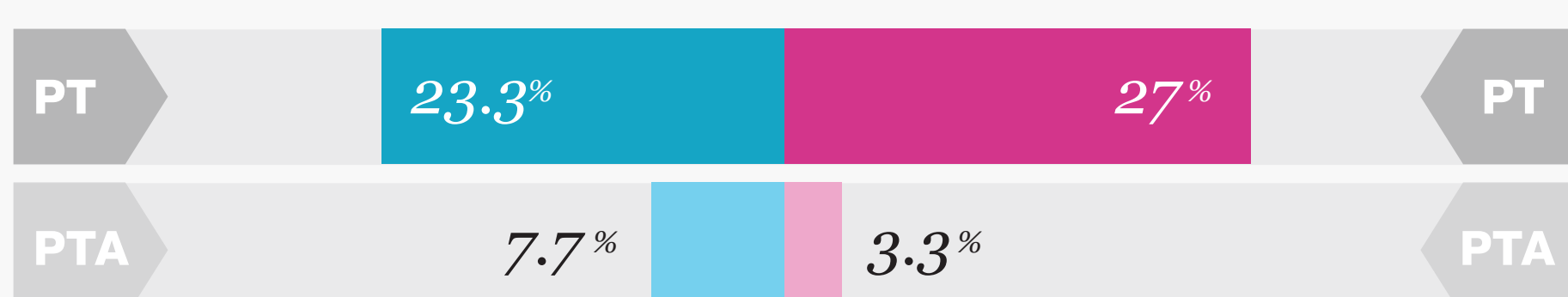


of male PTAs earn more than **\$65,000** per year.

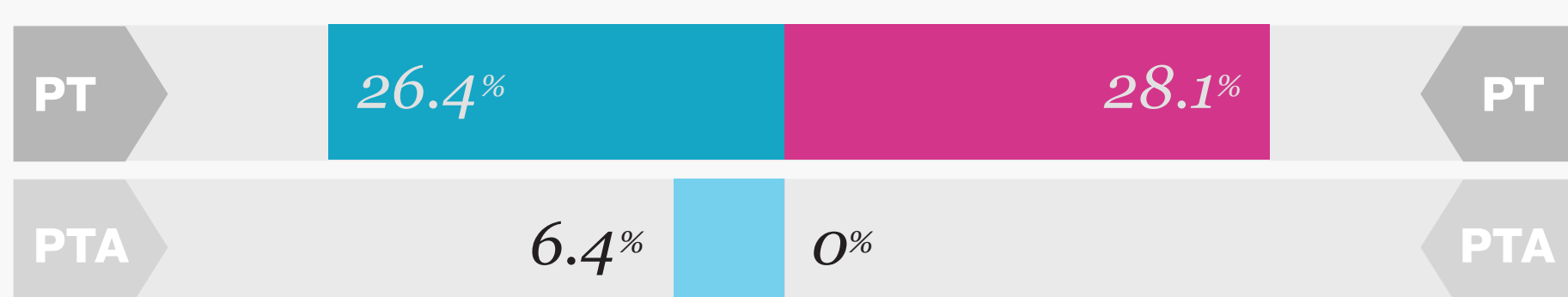


of female PTAs earn more than **\$65,000** per year.

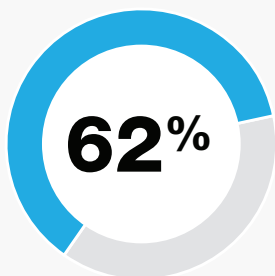

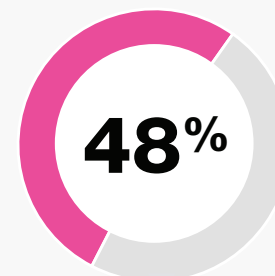
MALE VS. FEMALE PT SALARIES

Though PT is traditionally viewed as a male-dominated profession, two-thirds of respondents to our survey were female.



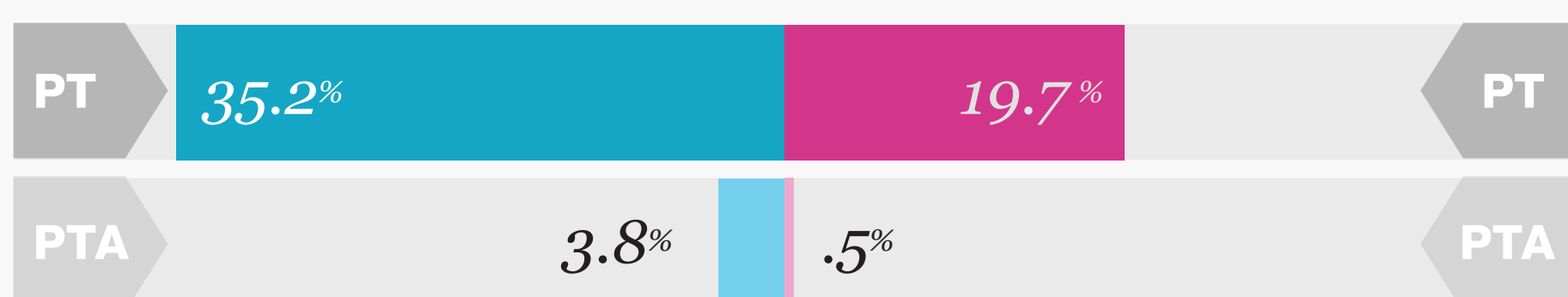
of male PTs earn more than **\$85,000** per year.
